“LIVING CITIES” SURVEY IN HONG KONG

Highlights of Findings

October 2016

Background

- In August 2016, the HKUPOP was commissioned by Grosvenor Asia Pacific Limited to carry out this “Living Cities” Survey in Hong Kong.
- Objectives:
 - To find out the happiness level in the neighborhood;
 - To identify the perceived attributes to a great neighborhood; and
 - To gauge respondents’ views on Hong Kong as a living city.
- POP had consulted Grosvenor Asia Pacific Limited when designing the questionnaire but POP enjoyed full autonomy in every aspect of the study. In return, we will take full responsibility for the design and all findings reported.
- All survey findings will be open for public consumption.

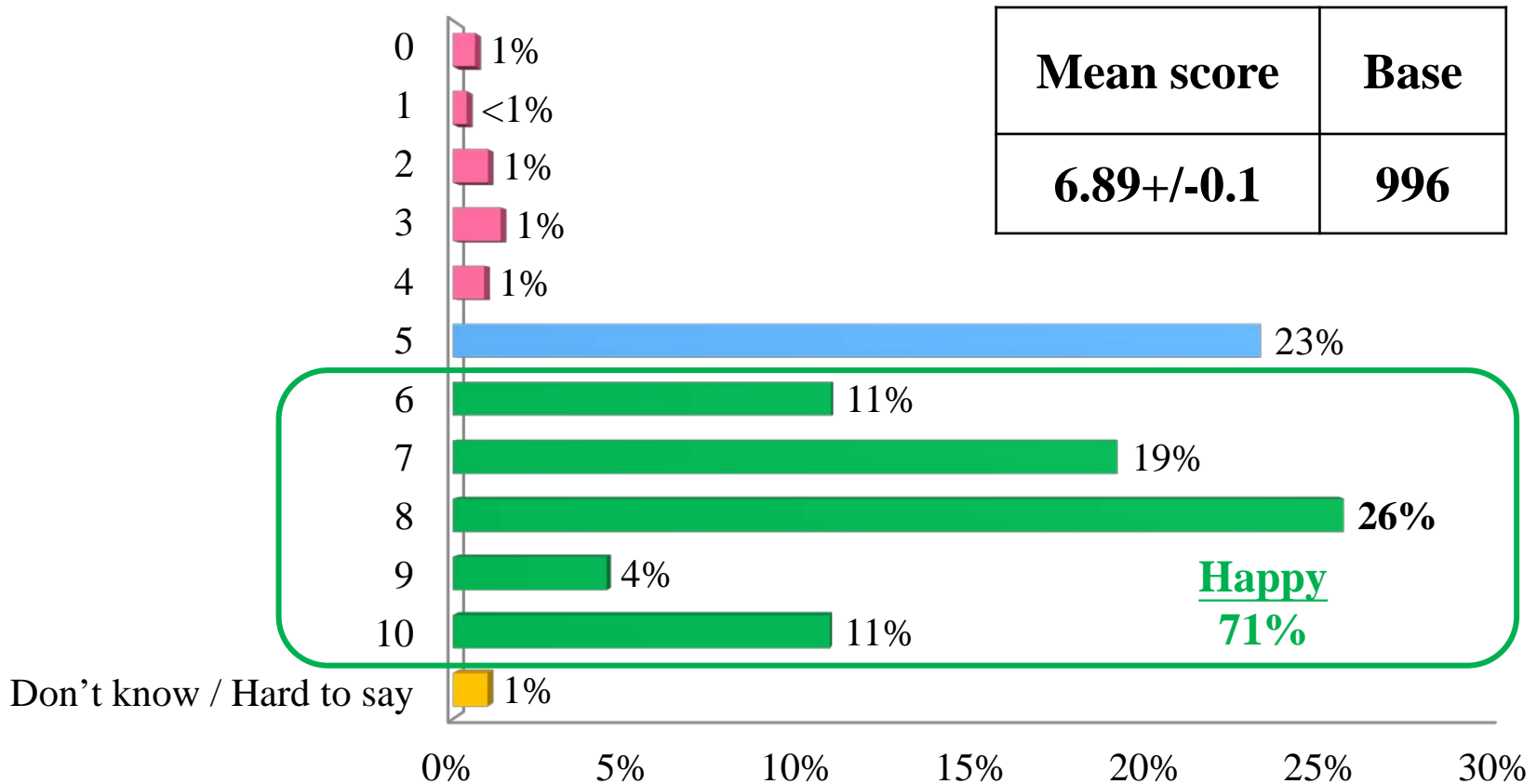
Contact Information

Date of survey:	29 August to 15 September 2016
Target population:	Hong Kong residents aged 18 or above who speak Cantonese
Survey method:	Random telephone survey conducted by telephone interviewers
Sample size:	1,006 successful cases
Response rate:	68.1%
Standard error:	Less than 1.6% (i.e., the maximum sampling error of all percentages should be no more than +/-3.2 percentage points at 95% confidence level)
Weighting:	The data has been rim-weighted according to latest figures from the Census and Statistics Department regarding the gender-age and educational attainment distribution of the Hong Kong population.

Findings

Happiness in Neighborhood

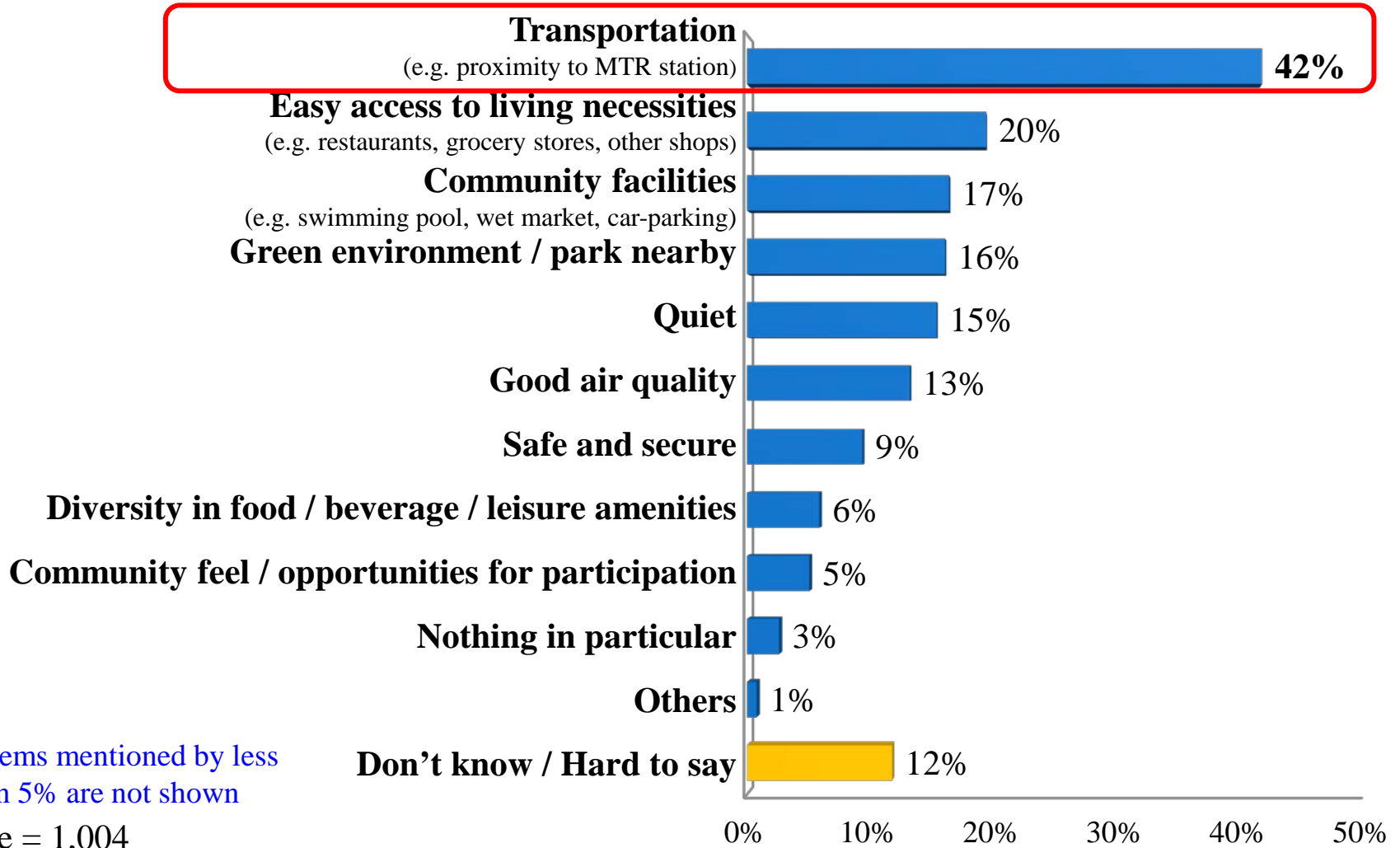
Over 70% are happy in the neighborhood they are living in



Base = 1,006

[Q1] How happy are you in the neighborhood you are living in? Please rate on a scale of 0 to 10, where 0 means very unhappy, 10 means very happy and 5 means half-half.

Ease of transportation tops the list when it comes to what people like most about their neighborhood

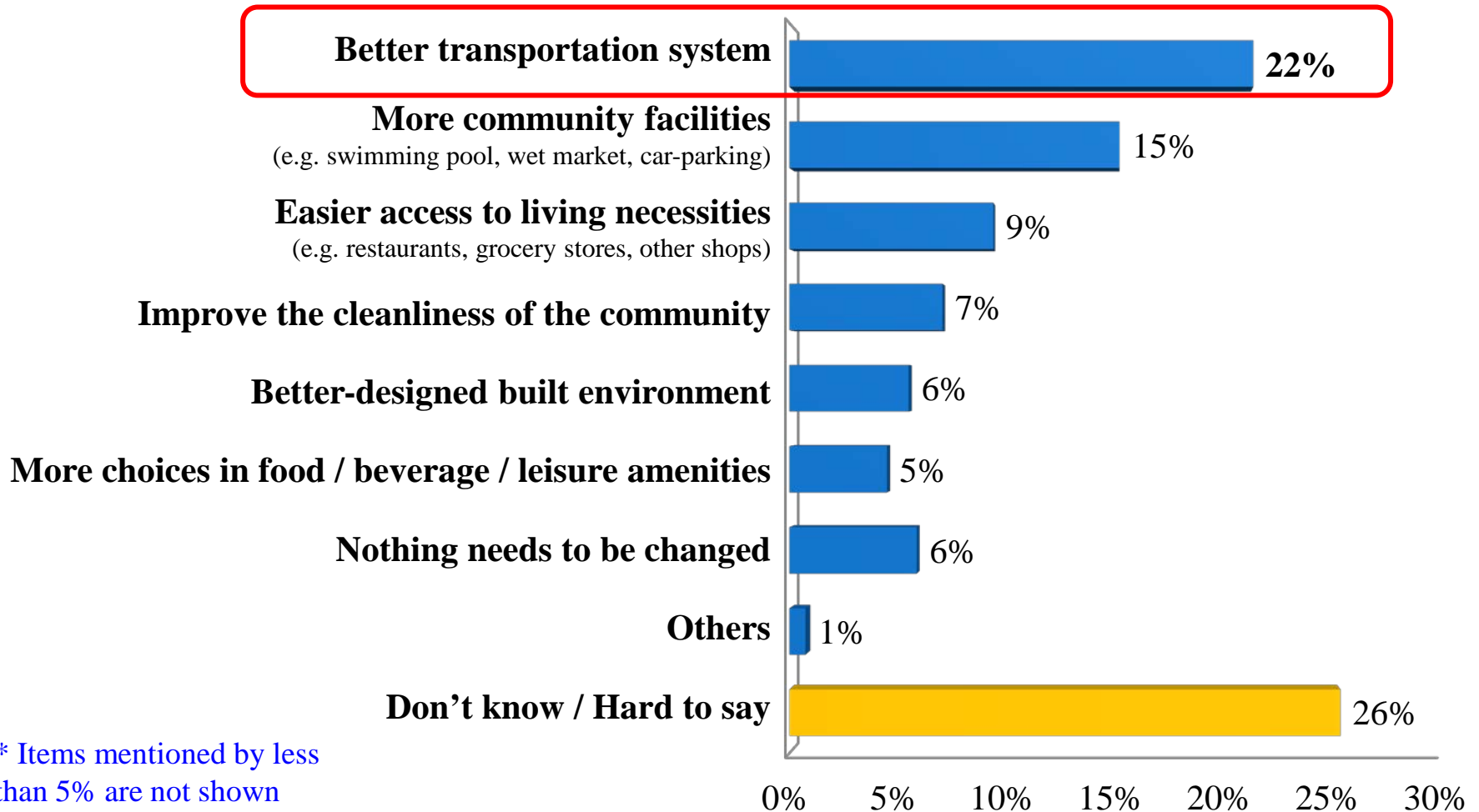

A better transportation system again ranks first for the improvement most wanted



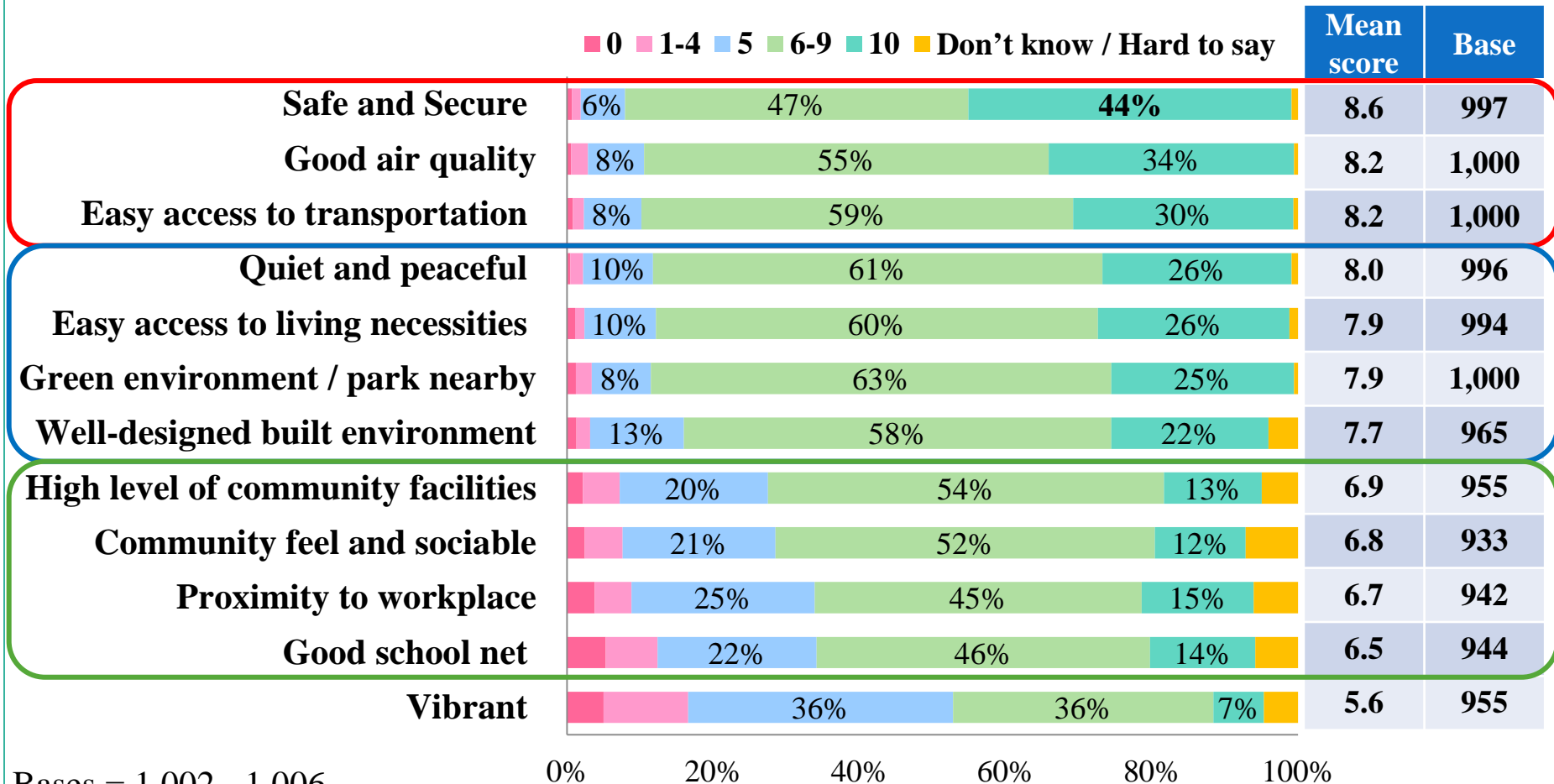

Conditions for Quality Living

Top 3 factors in choosing a neighborhood: Safe and Secure, Air Quality & Transportation

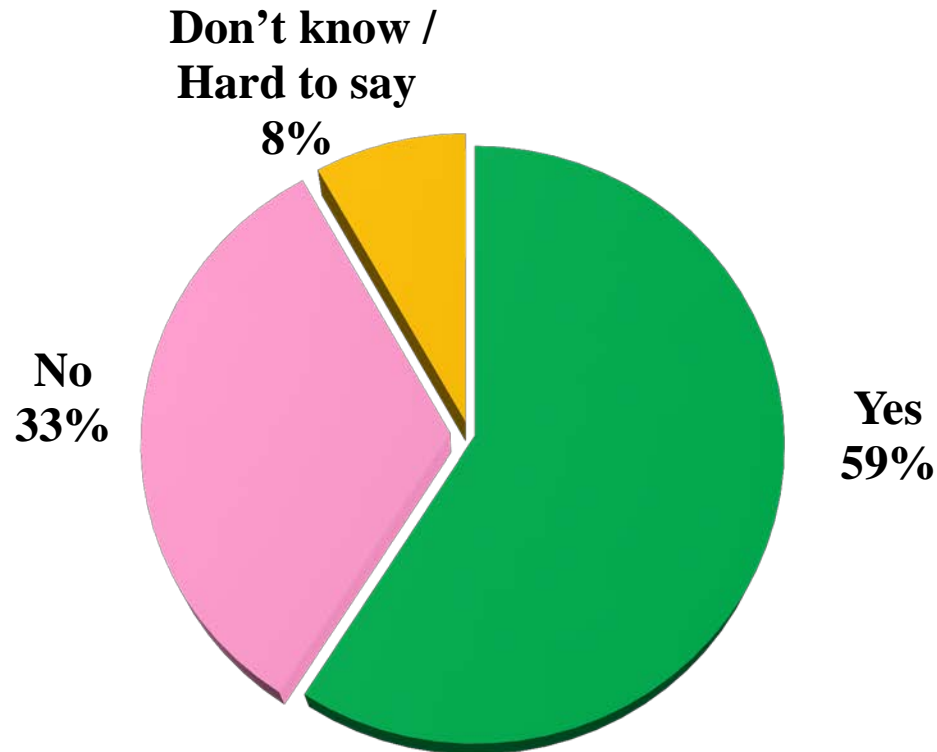

[Q4] How important are the following factors to you when you choose a place to live? Please also rate on a scale of 0 to 10, where 0 means not important at all, 10 means very important and 5 meaning half-half. [Interviewer to read out items 1-12, order to be randomized by computer.]

Hong Kong as a Living City

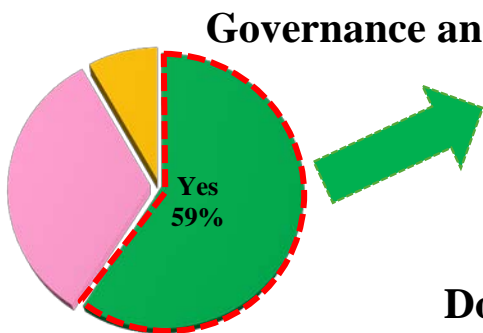
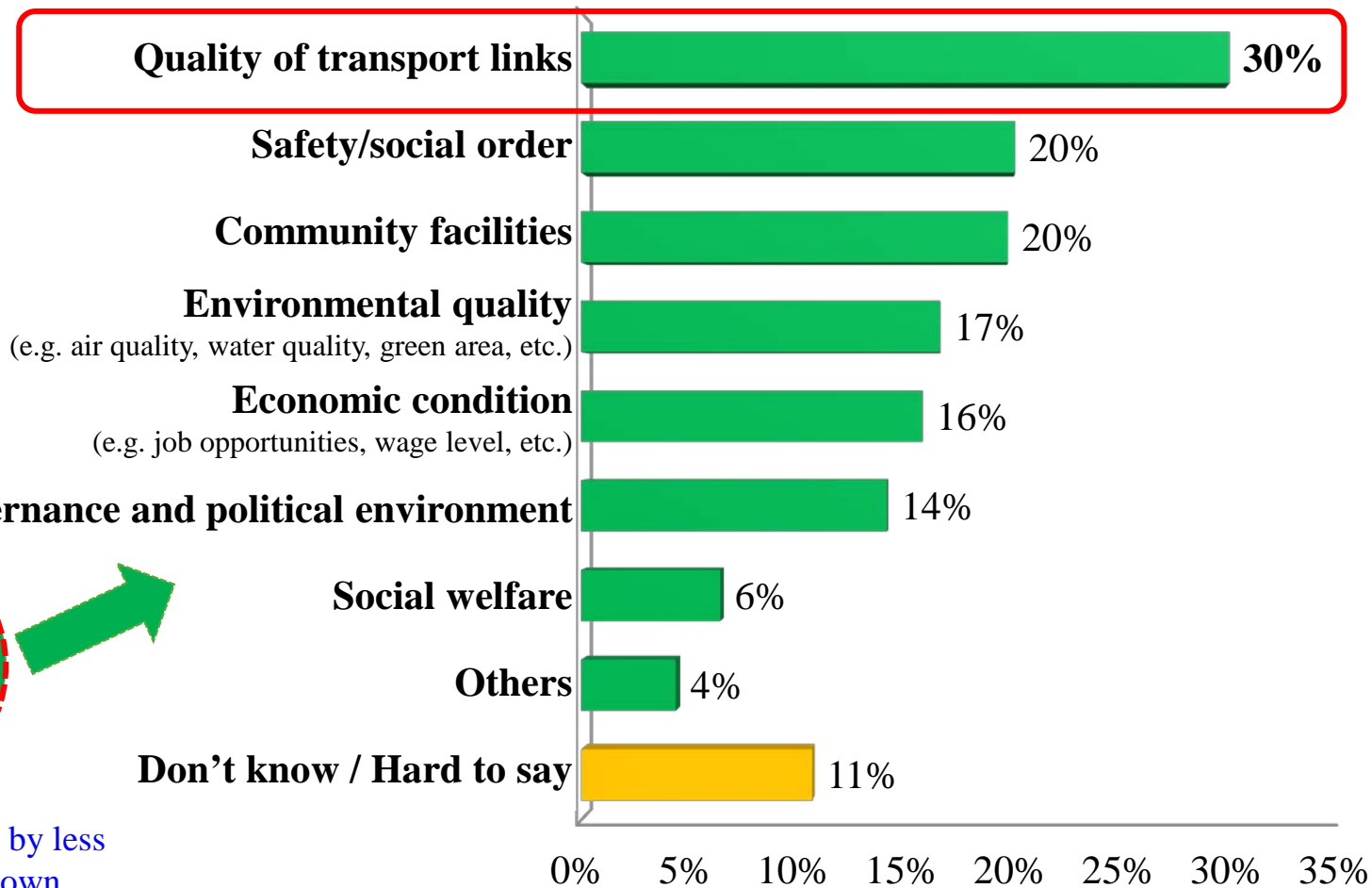
Near 60% think Hong Kong is a place that provides good quality of life

[Q5a] Do you think Hong Kong is a place that provides good quality of life? [Interviewers to probe intensity]

30% attribute “quality of transport links” the main reason that HK can provide good quality of life

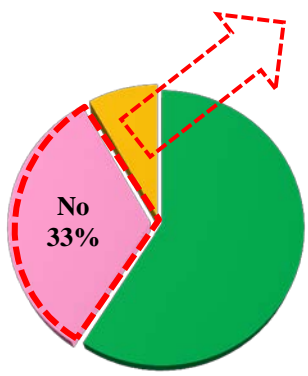
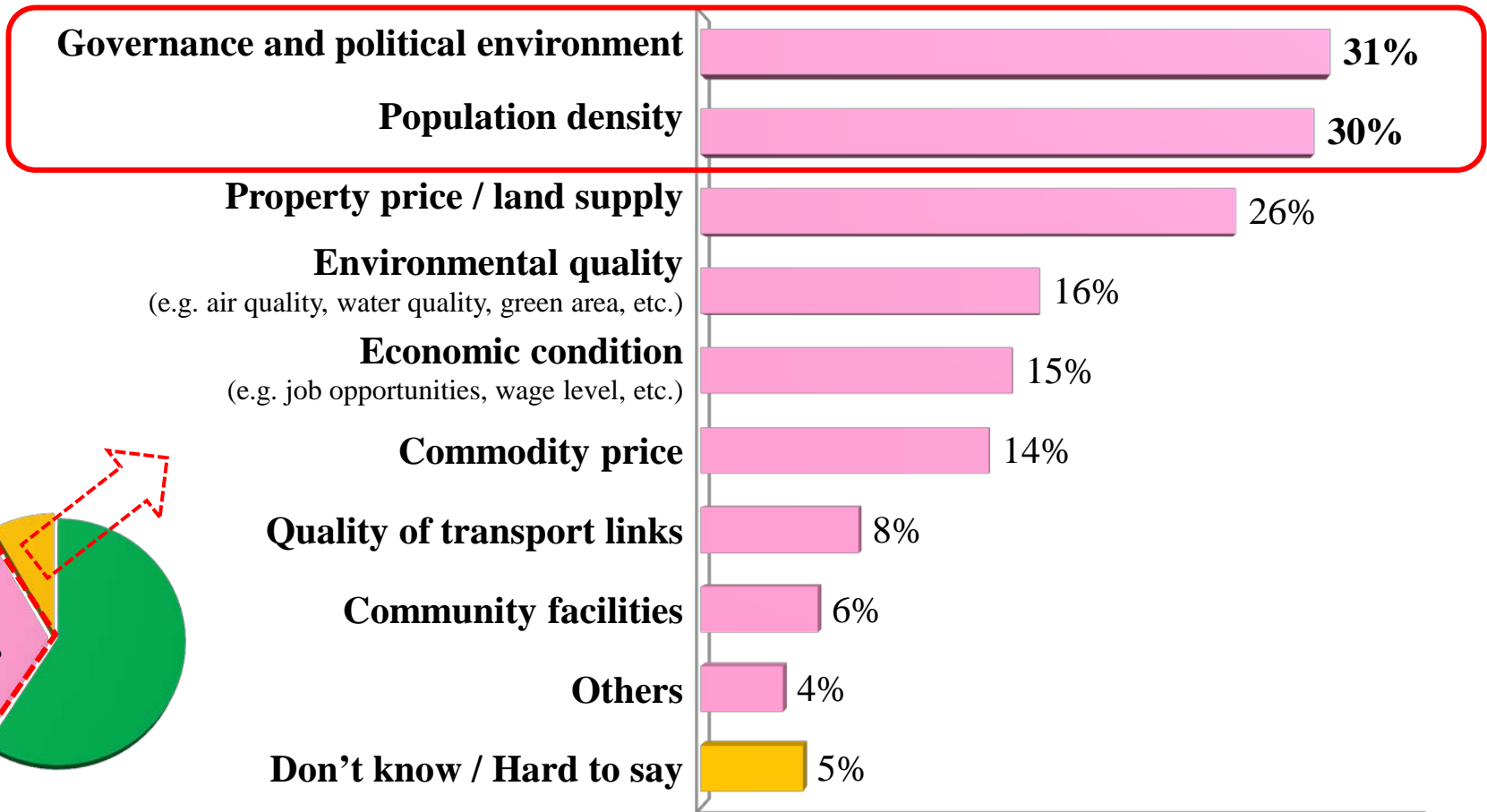

While the “governance and political environment” and “population density” are the two major alarms to quality living in HK

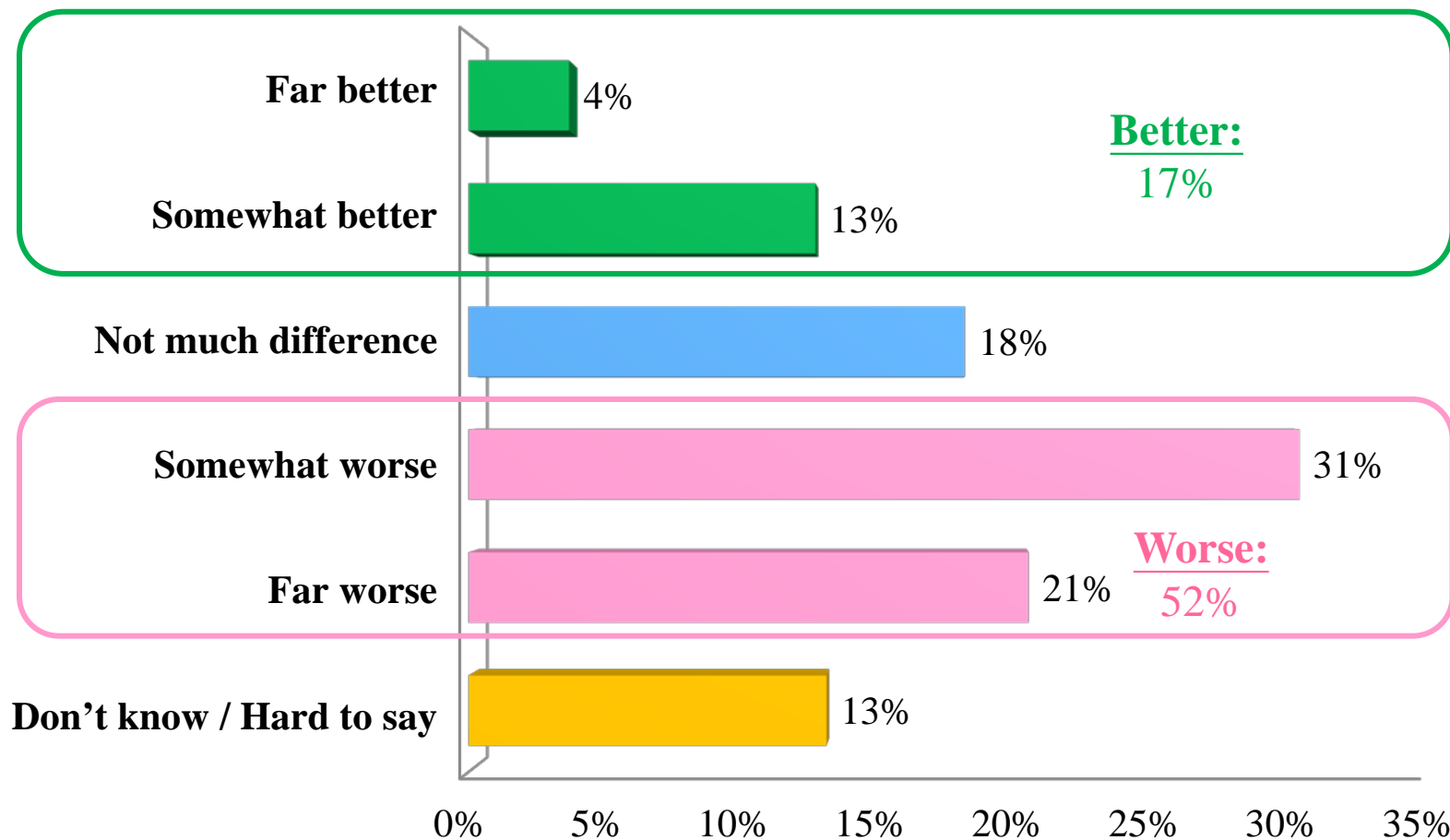

Over half are pessimistic & foresee a worsening of the overall quality of life in HK in 5 years time

Concluding Remarks

Concluding Remarks

- Hong Kong people are generally happy in the neighborhood they are living in.
- Transportation is apparently the key factor that makes a good neighborhood and a great city in the eyes of the Hong Kong people.
- When choosing a neighborhood, “safe and secure” stood out as the most vital factor, followed by “good air quality”, “easy access to transportation” and then being “quiet and peaceful”.
- Majority of respondents regard Hong Kong as a place that provides good quality of life, mainly attributing to its quality of transport links again. For those who think the opposite, most put the blame on the current political environment and its high population density.
- Looking ahead, the sentiment is somewhat gloomy as over half believe the quality of life in Hong Kong will get worse in 5 years’ time.
